ENVOI

As the sun finally comes out with the apple blossom, the benefice is shifting into top gear for a very busy couple of months with the feasts of Ascension, Whitsun and Trinity, weddings galore, fêtes, the Hood Service, the William Gilpin Tri-centenary and St John's patronal festival. In this joyful season, let's not forget to pray during this Rogationtide for the farmers who haven't been able to sow their crops, and others whose animals are diseased because of the rainy weather. I've heard that for some farmers this year in the UK, for the first time ever, there will simply be *no* harvest at all. What this year's harvests will be like elsewhere in communities experiencing extreme and unpredictable weather, or who have depended on Ukrainian wheat exports, heaven only knows. The causes of famine and food insecurity are complex and beyond our direct control, but the one plentiful thing assured us is opportunities to share what we have with people who have a lot less. And please don't forget the food bank collections in our churches and in supermarkets.
